From the Rector

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

This morning I watched as a man cleaned the chimneys. He cleaned in a very thorough but tidy way, and when each chimney was cleaned he tested the draught by lighting a little smoker which really did make a massive amount of smoke. When the smoke came billowing out of the chimney he knew a good job had been done.

This made me think about my life in relation to faith and in particular with the experience of Jesus during his 40 days in the wilderness.

There are many things coming across our lives each day which can act like the soot in the chimney, and the clear flow of God the Holy Spirit can be quenched as other things become the 'soot' in our lives.

The wilderness temptations of Jesus are, I believe, designed so we can identify with each one and realise that there is a way to victory - Jesus used the scriptures and that must be our main source in our battle against the different attacks of the 'soot'.

Power, wealth, the satisfying of human desires, and to be seen as working in the spectacular were all temptations Jesus overcame in the human. Sometimes we can forget that he was human as well as divine and therefore suffered many of the emotional pressures we encounter daily.

What a difference we would see in our country, in our church and in our own lives if we each decided to apply the flue brush of scripture to our lives and live in its light daily.

I believe that if the full truth of what happened when Jesus suffered, died, rose again and ascended would really hit us we would never cease to be amazed. What a wonderful Saviour!

In order for Newcastle Residents' Association to receive funding for a new walk in the village, a Health Check of Newcastle village is required. This will involve mapping both the people and the place. This entails mapping the population and socioeconomic profile, public engagement, pedestrian counts and observation, and movement tracing. It also entails mapping the village environment including building use, occupancy vs vacancy, public buildings and public space, accessibility, car parking, and hard landscaping and street furniture. So don't be surprised if you see unusual activity in the village or if you are asked questions about the village and its environment.

The Bowls Club meets on Thursdays at 8pm in the Main Hall at the Parish Centre.



Music in Calary

Music in Calary is delighted that the committee of Bray Jazz Festival have selected Calary Church as a venue for



one of their "on the road" concerts celebrating the 20th anniversary of the Jazz Festival. On Friday 3 May, Dowry, a multi-instrumentalist composer, arranger and songwriter whose music combines elements of experimental folk, ambient instrumental, contemporary classical, Irish traditional and country music, will play in Calary Church.

The stage name of Éna Brennan, born in Brussels to parents who are Danish and Irish, Dowry begins every set with a completely improvised violin piece using loops and pedals, before launching into a collection of melodies on either bass, guitar, violin or looped voice. Dowry is one of the most talked about acts in the Irish live scene and one of Hot Press magazine's hot tips for 2019.

This promises to be a wonderful musical event and tickets, which are €15 and €12 for concessions, and can be booked through Bray Jazz Festival's site at https://www.brayjazz.com/artists/dowry

To qualify as a subscriber the person must have subscribed annually to the Parish in an identifiable manner (e.g. through the Free Will Offering or Sustentation envelopes or by standing order) at least the amount specified each year by the Select Vestry.

The minimum amount so specified is €500 per household.


Holy Communion is celebrated every Wednesday, with prayer for the sick, at 10.30am in St Matthew's.
