We are well served by our Lay Readers who are not just 'fillers in' when we are desperate for help but have a very important part in the life and ministry carried out in our parish not only for the parishioners but are colleagues which support and encourage me in the work and ministry we endeavour to do.

In supporting your parish the easy thing, and perhaps not so easy, is to feel that giving is to do solely with monitory contributions, but, I believe the most important thing we can give is ourselves and that is our time. You may not have noticed that I have not mentioned any names so far. This list is not exhaustive and there are more duties carried out in the parish day by day and week by week by faithful people who give their time. Sincere thanks to you all and may we look forward to serving God together with whatever gift he has given you.
