A letter from Revd. Niall

Dear Friends

The Revd Ross Styles, Curate in the Christ Church Cathedral Group of Parishes, Dublin, has been appointed Rector of these parishes. The announcement was made in both parishes on Sunday November 22nd.

The Revd Styles grew up in in the parish of Ballynure, CoWicklow, part of the Baltinglass Group of Parishes. Following school in Kilkenny College he studied horticulture, which was the focus of his working life in various private and public sectors. As a mature student he graduated from UCD with a degree in history and economics. He is married to Fiona and they have two children, Ben (10) and Ava (8).

In 2010 he began the foundation course in the Church of Ireland Theological Institute and in the following year he joined the part—time master's in theology course. He was ordained deacon in 2015 and spent two years as a deacon intern with Canon David Mungavin in the parish of St Patrick's, Greystones.

In 2017 he was ordained priest and has served as Curate in the Christ Church Cathedral Group of Parishes for the last three years.

Commenting on his appointment, Ross says: "It is a great honour to have been appointed to the parishes of Newcastle,

Newtownmountkennedy with Calary and I am humbled by this faith in me. I have really enjoyed my time as curate in the Christ Church Cathedral Group of Parishes. I have learnt so much and I will always be truly grateful for the warmth and care that Archdeacon Pierpoint and all the parishioners have shown to Fiona, Ben, Ava and me. We will be sad to say farewell, but we are thoroughly looking forward to serving and getting to know the people of Newcastle, Newtownmountkennedy and Calary and becoming part of their community of faith. How Our Community Can Help Another

Newcastle & Newtownmountkennedy Parish is reaching out to help others less fortunate this Christmas. We are helping The Lighthouse Homeless Centre in Pearse Street, Dublin which has teamed up with Tiglin's homeless outreach No Bucks Cafe during the Covid-19 pandemic. The Lighthouse helps the homeless and children in poverty in the Dublin area. They provide 300 meals a day, six days a week, and this year the Parish is collecting items to put some Care Packages together for children in poverty and the homeless.

The Lighthouse, which works closely with children in poverty, holds weekly/yearly activities, camps, afterschool clubs etc. These care packages will be delivered to their family homes in the lead up to Christmas. Care packages will also be handed out to the homeless with their Christmas meal (which is being provided by St Patrick's Church, Greystones)

See the flyer which outlines items that you can donate. Children are welcome to include a card/note/drawing also, as this little gesture means so much to those who receive the packages. We are hoping to use backpacks/rucksacks or string packs for the packages so they can be reused. So donations of new (or next to new) bags would also be appreciated.


