#### From the Rector

Dear friends,

We are entering the season of Advent, a season of hope and expectation. Each Sunday in Advent, we light a candle on our Advent wreaths, flickering and shining their light into our churches and homes. As the evenings grow shorter, we can see the candles clearly. They appear brighter and more distinct to us the darker it becomes, and as nighttime falls, they appear quite brilliant in the inky surroundings, little beacons of light in a sea of darkness. And the light from a single candle can be seen from a great distance in total darkness. As I have mentioned before at a family service, the human eye could detect the flicker of a candle in total darkness, with a direct line of sight, at 46km away, or 30 miles. It seems an impossible task for a tiny little flame to emit light that can be seen from that distance but it can. And the strange thing is that that little beam of light can be seen further the darker the world around it is. Truly light can cut through darkness, the light only becomes stronger the darker it gets.

In our day to day lives, particularly with the current news, it is all too easy to become overwhelmed with our worries and concerns. For over twenty months, Covid-19 has shaken our routines and our lives. Sadly this Christmas may not show a return to 'normal' that we had hoped for. It is with a heavy heart that we have had to cancel Sunday Club, the Nativity, youth club, confirmation classes and many other parish social activities but we must be sensible, follow guidance and keep our community safe.

It is at these times that our world can appear to be an uncertain place. Yet we are not alone. If a small bulb or a candle can shine far out into the darkness, how much further can the light of Jesus' love shine? As the mirrors of a lighthouse amplify and direct light into the darkness, so too can we take that light that Jesus brings to us and reflect it in how we live our lives and in how we share our lives with others, in how we treat others.

In this season of Advent, my first in these parishes, we progress in expectation to the joy of Christmas! Let us reflect that light, that love and that joy into all aspects of our lives and our community. Jesus is the bearer of that light, his love is there for all, it is up to us to open the door and let it shine into our lives, into our world. Let us not lose hope.

Fiona, Ben, Ava and I would like to wish you all a blessed and a peaceful Christmas and a Happy New Year.

May the light of the Christ Child fill you with joy and peace.
