

### **Calary News**





# Talk on the humanitarian convoy to Ukraine in December 2023

In December 2023, Sandy Blackley, who has recently moved to Newcastle, Co Wicklow, was part of a convoy of 4x4 jeeps carrying Humanitarian Aid to Ukraine.

He received huge support both in cash and medical aids not only in the North Cork area, but from supporters throughout Ireland and abroad.

During the trip which involved 3000km driving through France, Belgium, Germany and Poland he sent back reports to his local newspaper which gave extensive coverage. On returning to Fermoy he put together an edited 45min presentation which has been received by three groups of 60 people in the North Cork area.

With the support of the Newcastle and Newtownmountkennedy with Calary group of parishes he will be giving this presentation on Saturday 1st March at 7pm in the Parish Centre, Newcastle, A63 X782.

This is not a fundraising exercise but rather an opportunity to thank supporters and to keep the issue of Ukraine alive. No tickets are needed but there will be a basket at the door for contributions for a Ukraine Support group.



### In honour of Carrot Cake Day! on February 3rd, 2025

### Spiced Carrot & appple muffins

#### Ingredients

100ml rapeseed oil

100ml natural yogurt

50ml runny honey

2 eggs

1 tsp vanilla extract

200g self-raising flour

1 tsp bicarbonate of soda

11/2 tsp ground mixed spice

1 apple grated

1 carrot grated

50g sultanas, raisins, chopped nuts or seeds (optional)

#### Method

Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4 and line a muffin tin with nine cases.

Mix the oil, yogurt, honey, eggs and vanilla in a iug.

In a bowl, combine the flour, bicarb, mixed spice and ¼ tsp salt. Pour the yogurt mixture into the flour mixture and add the apple and carrot.

Mix with a spatula until well combined, then spoon the mixture into the muffin cases.

Bake for 20-22 mins, or until a skewer inserted into the middle of a muffin comes out clean.

Leave to cool for at least 5 mins.

Can be stored in a tin for three days or frozen for two months; defrost overnight before serving.

## Our Garden Birds

During the winter short days and long nights limit the time birds have to forage, while at the same time natural food becomes more scarce. Our garden birds have increasingly come to depend on the food we provide as an essential supplement to what they can find for themselves at this challenging time of year. According to bird conservation organisations like Birdwatch Ireland and the RSPB, it's a good idea to feed your garden birds throughout the year, but it's especially important to do so over the coldest, darkest months of winter (Dec – March). Small birds need to pack in enough calories during the few hours of daylight to see them through the long winter night ahead. Having a convenient, high-energy food source in your garden can literally mean the difference between life and death for some of them.

- 1. Place your feeders where you can see them
  - 2. Once you start feeding, don't stop

3. Variety = diversity

If you want to attract more species the best way is to offer more variety in your feeders.

Quality, not quantity
 Use a high quality bird seed mix it, generally has less "filler".

- 5. Don't forget the water!
- Clean your feeders regularly.

7. Little and often It's better to provide just enough food, and top up your feeders often.

8. If you see a sick or dead bird, do not touch it. Please report it to the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine via their Avian Check app:
