From the Rector's Desk

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Certain things in life really amaze me and I am sure we all have things that amaze us and leave us speechless. Occasionally I go for a walk to Newcastle Beech at night time. The nights I remember most are the frosty winter nights when the sky is clear of clouds and the stars are twinkling brightly overhead. As one walks towards five mile point, among the big rocks, helping to prevent coastal erosion, there is a rock with a reasonably flat surface perfectly shaped for someone my size to lie on. Many of you may have identified this particular rock and had similar experiences to me while resting there. I sometimes lie flat on this rock and look at the stars. At first they are beautiful and they twinkle and as I look for longer I see more and more all the time. It is then that my mind begins to go 'completely into orbit'.

Science tells us that one light year is about 5.88 trillion miles. A light beam needs only 8 minutes to travel the 93 million miles from the sun to the earth. Apart from the sun the nearest star to earth, Alpha Centauri, is 4.4 light years away. If we place the distance from earth to the sun at one inch then the distance to Alpha Centauri is 4.4 miles. and completely mind boggling is the fact that one of the most distant known galaxies from earth is Sombreo Galaxy. Using the same scale of one inch from sun to earth, this galaxy is 65,000,000 miles away. This is too much for my little mind to comprehend but it is amazing.

Something else that I have been reading about is the world population explosion. In 1950 world population was 2.5 billion, by 2000 it had reached 6 billion and today is about 7.5 billion. An alarming rate of growth by any standard. Food shortage, over population, resistance to many known antibiotics, extreme religious groups, the growth in drug abuse, and the list could go on, is what we face in our little planet earth in 2016.

All this takes on a very different perspective when we appreciate the grandeur and vastness of God's creation. Without a belief in a God who cares and wants to intervene in peoples lives there would be little hope for any of us. Suffering will always be part of this life but as people of faith we can lift our sights above the fear and uncertainty of the future and hold to the sure promises of God our creator. Jesus said ' My peace I give to you, not as the world gives, do not let your hearts be troubled neither let them be afraid' He wants us to be people of hope, not fear; people looking to better things than this world can ever afford. This only comes true for us as we learn to know and trust him in our own lives and experience.

May we grow in his grace in his love and in his peace.
