Parish of Newcastle & Newtownmountkennedy Treasurer's Report Summary Statement of Accounts Year ended 31st December 2021

2021 marked a new start in the life of the Parish with the arrival of Ross and his family in February. On the downside, lockdowns continued due to Covid-19, substantially influencing how we as a parish worshipped, socialised and fundraised. This in turn had a knock-on effect on the financial situation. The **Parish** had an overall surplus for the year of $\in 10,024$, which was a good result given the circumstances. However, this amount masks some varying trends in the account sub-sections.

Giving in the form of cash collections, weekly envelopes and sustentation (twice yearly giving towards the running of the Parish) amounted to \notin 43,026. This continued a downward trend - \notin 48,043 in 2020, \notin 53,291 in 2019. While this is understandable given the lack of services in our churches, and a disconnect with parishes in general during the lockdowns, it is nevertheless a worrying trend and something which needs to be addressed. I would like to thank those parishioners who give regularly by bank transfer or standing order. These payments have been the lifeblood of the parish over the past year.

Fundraising amounted to €18,166 which was an excellent result. We were lucky enough to be able to run several fundraisers, all outdoors, including Go the Distance, the Garden Trail, the Summer Party, and the very successful Gift Day. Many thanks to the Events Committee who organised these events and to everyone who participated and donated.

Collections, fundraisers and sponsorship for **Charity** amounted to \notin 3,794 doubling the figure for 2020.

Income from Properties was \notin 30,785, compared to \notin 38,903 in 2020. This drop was due to a delay in receipt of income from St Matthew's Tower while a new contract is negotiated.

Costs for Upkeep and Running of the Churches were €13,570.

Rectory costs were €11,654 down from €20,096 in 2020. This figure includes the last of the refurbishment work on the Rectory and should be substantially reduced in 2022.

Costs for other properties were $\notin 14,586$, an increase on $\notin 6,872$ in 2020. This amount includes the cost of upgrading the bathroom in Rectory Cottage.

Office costs were \notin 5,445. The higher than usual costs reflect the large amount of printing which was done during the year when we could not use the hymn and prayer books in church.

The **Parish Centre** made an overall profit of $\notin 26,351$. This excellent result was entirely driven by the profit made by **Castle Kidz Childcare** which reported a balance of $\notin 30,839$ at the end of the year. In fact, the Parish as a whole remained financially viable due to this outcome and is in the lucky position of starting 2022 with a stable financial situation. I would like to thank the staff at Castle Kidz for their work and dedication in very difficult circumstances. The pandemic increased their workload substantially. I would also like to thank the Select Vestry for having the foresight to decide to run the service as a Parish venture. Not only has that decision kept the Parish financially afloat over the last two years, but it has also enabled continued contact with very many young families.

Once again the outstanding item still remaining in the **Parish Development Project** is the finishing coat of tarmac at Glebe Lane. An outstanding bond for Glebe Lane of \in 50,000 is still to be repaid by Wicklow County Council. This amount will then be returned to the segregated accounts which were used to part-fund the project at the initial stages of the development. Hopefully, now that society has opened up again, this can be completed.

Looking forward to 2022:

The year ahead will be a challenging one. Both of our very old and very beautiful churches require substantial work. We have been lucky enough to receive grant funding for the first phase of work on St Matthew's Church but this represents 80% of the cost and we must find the balance. This will be followed by further phases of work in following years. Newcastle Church also needs a large amount of work on the church tower and the boundary walls and it is intended to apply for grant funding for it also. The upshot is that a large amount of outlay will be required on both churches, aside from any grant funding received. I am aware that costs have increased for us all, but I would ask, where it is possible, that you continue to support the Parish and I would like to thank all of you who continued your support through 2021, enabling the Parish to pay its way. Our financial situation would have been grave without your generosity.

Sincere thanks to all who support the Parish in any way, both financially and in giving of time and skills. The Parish would not continue without the large number of people who form a support network which allows it to operate day to day.

Particular thanks to John and Laura Langrell who record and lodge the church collections all year, to Tina Donohoe who organises the tax refund on giving by parishioners, to Jean Harris who orders and distributes the weekly envelopes, and to Mark Reade for his help and advice, and for auditing these final accounts.
