Dear Parishioners and Friends,

It is also a time when the comics have their 'hey day'. Many stories are told about politicians and governments and one that I thought very smart was that of Paddy saying to Mick "If you think you are getting too much government, just be thankful you're not getting as much as you're paying for"!
