#### From the Rector

Dear friends,

It is hard to believe but February 12<sup>th</sup> 2022 marked a year since Fiona, Ben, Ava and I arrived in the parishes of Newcastle, Newtownmountkennedy with Calary. It doesn't feel like a year, time has flown! We, as a family, arrived to live in the rectory during level 5 lockdown, which led to many curious Garda checkpoints on the N11, querying our movements with yet another car full of personal possessions! We will be forever grateful for the way that we have been so warmly welcomed into this amazing and vibrant community, we are very blessed.

It was a strange twelve month period for everybody but hopefully we have emerged from our shared experiences stronger and better prepared for what the future holds. It is exciting as we prepare to return to normal parish life over the next few months. The lifting of restrictions is giving us an opportunity to reopen and reconnect. As a result, many parish activities resumed in February, with a return of our youth club, Sunday club, coffee mornings, table tennis, confirmation classes and much more! I am looking forward to the year ahead, as we leave restrictions behind us and see our parishes grow and return to what they should be - vibrant, supportive, caring, welcoming, fun, faith based, community centred, living examples of God's love for us all.

This coming Wednesday, 2<sup>nd</sup> March, is Ash Wednesday, the start of Lent:

Brothers and sisters in Christ: since early days Christians have observed with great devotion the time of our Lord's passion and resurrection. It became the custom of the Church to prepare for this by a season of penitence and fasting. At first this season of Lent was observed by those who were preparing for baptism at Easter and by those who were to be restored to the Church's fellowship from which they had been separated through sin. In course of time the Church came to recognize that, by a careful keeping of these days, all Christians might take to heart the call to repentance and the assurance of forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel, and so grow in faith and in devotion to our Lord. I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Lord to observe a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy word. The introduction to the Ash Wednesday service in the Book of Common Prayer highlights why, as Christians, we observe the season of Lent. We are called to keep these days, still our hearts and minds and hear the call to repentance and the assurance of forgiveness that are proclaimed in the gospel. We are invited to observe a holy Lent, through self examination and repentance, prayer, fasting and by reading and meditating on God's holy word.

Yet Lent is not all about giving things up, fasting or abstaining. In Lent we can also take things up! We can use this period of 40 days to make changes in our lives, to take up new activities, to perhaps give of our time to help others, to help those in our communities or perhaps further afield. Sadly we live in a world that needs help. Events in Ukraine are leading to a humanitarian crisis not seen in Europe since the end of the Second World War. This Lent, let us reflect on the importance of the sacrifice made for us all at Easter but let us also use these 40 days to make our world a better place.
