## MUSIC IN CALARY



2009 is a special year for Calary Parish, as the church was built 175 years ago in 1834 and to mark this several events are being planned. The church room has been significantly rebuilt and extended and will be blessed by Archbishop John Neill on Friday May 1st



The first concert held in Calary, which was to celebrate the Church's 150th anniversary, was organised in 1984 by Dame Ruth King and thus the seed for Music in Calary was sown. Since 1999, we have been fortunate to have been able to arrange regular concerts, which have kindly been supported financially by Wicklow County Council and FBD Insurance Ltd.

We have already organised a very exciting programme of concerts for this year:

- ♪ Saturday May 2<sup>nd</sup> the **Capilla Renacentista**, a chamber choir attached to the Complutense University of Madrid, are giving a very special concert 'Images of the Virgin Mary'. This will feature a fascinating selection of works by Palestrina and the Seville composer Gererro. This will be a rare opportunity for a Wicklow audience to hear this well known vocal group who perform regularly in Spain. They are devoted to early music and have a wide repertoire especially centered in Renaissance polyphony.
- ♪ Friday May 15th the **Attrampe quartet**, which is composed of students at the Royal Northern College of Music in Manchester and is led by **Ben Cashell** from Balbriggan, will perform works by Beethoven and Schubert. They will be joined by the well known young Wicklow cellist **Paul Grennan**.
- ♪ On **Friday June 12**, **Elizabeth Cooney** (violin) and **Redmond O'Toole** (guitar) will give a recital.
- ♪ It is hoped to have a weekend towards the end of June or early July which will include another concert for young Wicklow pianists together with concerts by **Fiachra Garvey** (piano) with **Ruth Gibson** (viola) and **Annette Cleary** (cello) with **Lance Coburn** (piano).
- ♪ In the autumn we hope to have an **Art Exhibition** and some further musical events.
