The Annual Vestry was held by Zoom on Tuesday 20 April and the following were elected:



# Parish of Newcastle & Newtownmountkennedy Treasurer's Report Summary Statement of Accounts year ended 31st December 2020

2020 was an extraordinary year in the life of the Parish. William Bennett retired as Rector at the end of February and this was followed shortly by the arrival of Covid -19. The effects of the lockdowns were masked in the final balance for the year as the diocesan assessment was substantially reduced during the vacancy. There were also wage subsidies provided by the government which helped with salaries during lockdown. The **Parish** had an overall surplus for the year of €11,793. However, subsections in the accounts were affected substantially.

**Giving** in the form of cash collections, weekly envelopes and sustentation (twice yearly giving towards the running of the Parish) amounted to  $\{0.48,0.43\}$ . This was down on the total for 2019 by  $\{0.5,0.48\}$ . The pattern of giving changed, reflecting the lack of services in our churches, with the majority of parishioners using bank transfer or standing order.

**Fundraising** amounted to €5,775, less than half of 2019's total. However, we were lucky to squeeze in one of our major fundraisers, the annual Theatre Dinner, before the first lockdown.

Collections, fundraisers and sponsorship for **charity** amounted to a paltry  $\leq 1.902$ , a fraction of the previous year's total of  $\leq 9,033$ .

**Income from properties** rose, increasing to €38,903 compared to €32,881 in 2019. This reflected a full year's rental income from Church Cottage and Rectory Cottage. Unfortunately the car park at St Matthew's is no longer rented out.

Costs for **upkeep and running of the churches** were €11,211, down from €13,915 the previous year.

**Rectory costs** were €20,096, reflecting the large amount of work requested by the Diocesan Architect to make the building ready for the new incumbent. More costs will be included in the accounts for 2021 as the final works are carried out.

Costs for other properties were €6,872, substantially reduced on 2019's total of €17,138.. Office costs were very similar to 2019 at €3600.

The **Parish Centre** made an overall loss of €4,885. This was disappointing after breaking even last year, but unsurprising given the lack of income from room rental due to the closure of the building for most of the year. Room rental last year came to just over €9000.

The loss would have been larger but fortunately **Castle Kidz** childcare made a profit of €6,730 after allocating electricity, fuel and administration costs. This was partly due to the support provided by the government to ensure the viability of childcare facilities during the enforced closures. The Playschool is running at maximum capacity and is fully booked for the next school year. The Afterschool suffered a reduction in numbers due to the pandemic and has reinvented as a club offering different activities each afternoon which is proving popular and offers hope that this service can continue.

The outstanding item still remaining in the **Parish Development Project** is the finishing coat of tarmac at Glebe Lane. An outstanding bond for Glebe Lane of €50,000 is still to be repaid by Wicklow County Council. This amount will then be returned to the segregated accounts which were used to part-fund the project at the initial stages of the development.

Looking forward to **2021**, the financial outlook is uncertain.

At the moment the Parish is running at a loss in the order of €7,000 per month. Giving continues to decline and our churches remain closed. The Parish Centre cannot generate income until there is a full re-opening of society. In the coming year there is a large amount of work to be carried out on our buildings which cannot be postponed. On the positive side, hopefully services can restart in a limited manner soon and there are plans to fundraise, adapting to the current situation, with a Gift Day and Go the Distance first on the list.

I would ask, where it is possible, that you continue to support the Parish and I would like to thank all of you who continued your support through 2020, enabling the Parish to pay its way. Our financial situation would have been grave without your generosity.

Sincere thanks to all who support the Parish in any way, both financially and in giving of time and skills. The Parish would not continue without the large number of people who form a support network which allows it to operate day to day.

Particular thanks to John and Laura Langrell who record and lodge the collections all year, to Tina Donohoe who organises the tax refund on giving by parishioners, to Jean Harris who orders and distributes the weekly envelopes, to my dear Dad, Mervyn Garrett, for all his work on the Parish Development Project and more, to Peter Johnston who has taken on the task of finishing the project, and to Mark Reade for his help and advice, and for auditing these final accounts.


