#### <u>Memorial Plaque</u>

Canon Robert Jennings in his recently published book "Newcastle Down the Years" expressed the hope that Newcastle Residents and other interested friends would erect a memorial plaque to eight unknown sailors buried in Newcastle Churchyard. This has now been arranged for Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> November, All Souls Day, at 3pm. Rev William Bennett and Father Liam Belton will lead the short ceremony. Anyone else who wishes to attend this event is welcome.

We are grateful to those who subscribed to this memorial; Newcastle Residents' Association, Wicklow Historical Society and some private individuals. The plaque will read as follows:

In memory of eight unnamed sailors buried nearby, four of whom lost their lives during the wreck of the Brig Elaine off Five Mile Point in 1883. In memory also of all those others interred here who are 'Known only to God'.

Captain Richard Jones, First Mate John Jones and George Wilson are buried in Nun's Cross Churchyard.
