#### From the Rector

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The Harvest weekend in Calary was a wonderful occasion when the Church and Parish Room were both lined with paintings and items of art. This year there were more paintings than ever and the standard seems to continue improving. Music lovers had a feast as the usual high standard was displayed for all who attended the concerts, and the large attendance at the thanksgiving service contributed to an electric atmosphere. This was greatly enhanced by Charlotte's choir which was inspirational.

I am very sorry to report to you all that Stephen O'Neill, who led the youth club, has moved from the area. Stephen, the youth worker in Greystones Parish, came to us in Newcastle on Friday evenings but has taken up a new post in Avoca. Sincere thanks to Stephen and also to Lucas Dowling for their work with the Youth Club. Lucas hopes to continue and we have a small committee looking at the whole youth department. We want to ensure the club continues, the junior club starts up, and that both clubs provide a safe space for our young people. We thank the Rector of Greystones, Canon David Mungavin, for allowing us have Stephen even though he had a very full programme in Greystones.

We welcome the Ven. Neal O'Raw as Archdeacon of Glendalough. He replaces Ricky Rountree as Archdeacon. Neal's installation took place on Sunday 21st October in Christ Church Cathedral and we are honoured that, I believe, his first official service as Archdeacon was to celebrate Holy Communion at St Matthew's on the 24th, after which he met the East Glendalough clergy team in the Parish Centre, Newcastle.

The Every Decade Service followed by lunch in the Parish Centre, planned for Sunday 25th November, has become a very important annual event. This service includes people from every decade taking part in leading and contributing to worship. It is a time to get to know some people who may be new to the parish, or perhaps can share something of particular interest about their lives. At the lunch we have the opportunity of sharing vision for next year and also assessing how the past year has gone. Please make a special effort to attend.

There are many plants in our gardens that are poisonous of which we are quite unaware and while those may not be likely to be consumed in mistake by adults there is always the risk of children and animals partaking of them with unpleasant consequences. Plants with red or black berries naturally attract children and the following is a general list of plants that might be found in our gardens or house:-


