From the Rector's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

The story is told about the little boy who was painting a picture on a sheet of paper. The teacher asked him what he was painting and the boy responded, "I am painting God". The teacher suggested that it would be very difficult to paint God because we really don't know what he looks like. The boy responded quickly, "We will when I have finished the picture"!

Relationships with friends must be worked on. We can't maintain relationships without communication, and that principle extends, in a very real way, to a relationship with God. In an increasingly secular society it is very easy to fall into the trap of feeling some comfort because we have a basic belief in the existence of God, but at the same time ignore most of what He has to say to us. Like the little boy we can have our own picture of what God is like, or perhaps what we'd like him to be. Our picture must be based on how he is revealed to us in the scriptures otherwise it's only our own picture.

The tendency is to have a one-sided picture of what God is like. Either He is the merciful loving father who forgives us regardless of what we do, or He is the judge who is very demanding and there to condemn any who might stray from the narrow way!

We develop our knowledge of God through study of the revelation of himself in scripture and we have a balanced view there. Focussing on either view to the exclusion of the broader picture leads to a gross misunderstanding. God is loving and forgiving but also demanding of our commitment and obedience. Obedience to God must reach far beyond ourselves and our own interests.

In a year when we, in this part of the world, have enjoyed a wonderful harvest, we pray that our picture of God will lead us to having thankful hearts and generous spirits so we can bless those who are very hard pressed, and be lights in a suffering, and largely confused, world.
